## From Our Director...

Thanks to all who turned in their library surveys. Charlotte Yoder was the winner of the \$50 gift certificate to the Norwich Bookstore. Happy reading Charlotte! 145 surveys have been counted and based on the results we can create a typical Norwich Public Library patron. You come to the library weekly and are between 40 and 65 years of age. You love to read fiction and nonfiction, watch DVDs and listen to audiobooks (CD rather than tape.) You know all about our services and use most of them. You prefer reading Bookmark in hardcopy. You find the staff and volunteers friendly and knowledgeable, and you desire cozy and comfy reading chairs. You'd like for us to offer a film series, armchair travel lectures and more author events, but most of you are, truthfully, too busy to attend. As for wishes, you want more, more, more! Most respondents wished for Sunday hours, more DVDs and more books on CD.

We'll take these results and use them in planning for the next two years. Adding hours on Sunday has been discussed and is part of the Long-Range Plan adopted in 2003. Next year's budgets for audio/video materials has been increased, but we continue to look for donations of these materials to help us fill out the collections. DVDs and audiobooks are more expensive to buy and maintain than books and we are exploring different avenues for obtaining them.

As for adult and kids' programming, it's clear that library patrons lead busy lives and so we will continue to experiment with different topics to see what piques people's interests. We understand that there's a lot to choose from in the Upper Valley and competition for people's time and energy is keen. Please let us know if there is something specific you'd like to see offered.

Dare I say spring has sprung? Since spring is about renewal and change, we've made some changes here too! Beth has been busy re-arranging the Children's Room and has created a Parenting section (call number PAR). The Local Alcove holdings were integrated into the regular collections and Stephanie is cataloging the magazine collection so that they can be checked out more efficiently. Next on the list is reseeding our muddy backyard!
