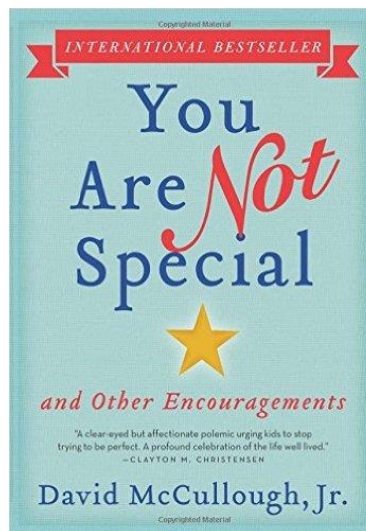
The world of Downton Abbey
