To access magazines, click on “Gale General OneFile.” To access newspapers, click on “Gale OneFile: News.” Gale Academic OneFile is useful for academic research, while Gale In Context: Elementary is aimed at a younger audience. For this example, we’re going to click on “Gale OneFile: News,” but similar search strategies can also be used for the other databases.

News & Magazines



Gale Academic OneFile

Quickly access articles from a database of scholarly journals and other trusted periodicals. Best for academic research.



Gale General OneFile

Access general interest magazines and key serials in a single resource. Best for general research.



Gale In Context: Elementary

Introduce elementary students to database searching with resources featuring age-appropriate, curriculum-related content.



Gale OneFile: News

Access major U.S. and international newspapers online to search articles instantly by title, headline, date, or other fields.

Once you're in the database, you can use the search bar to conduct a general keyword search. This will be most useful if you're looking for articles on a specific topic from any newspaper. If you'd like to find a specific newspaper, click on "Publication Search."

On the newspaper's main page, you'll see the database's coverage of the newspaper. Look at the full-text coverage dates. If you're looking for an article that falls within the listed date range, you should be able to find it in the database. If you know the date of the article you're looking for or want to browse articles from a certain issue of the paper, select the date you're looking for. (You may need to change the year first.) Alternately, you can search by keyword in the "search within publication" box. Any search here will only return results from the paper you're looking at.

Use the tools at the top of the page (within the purple box) to access a citation for the article, email the article to yourself, download the article, print it out, copy a link that will always bring you back to the article, or add your own highlighting and notes to the text. You can also change the font size or have the text read aloud by the computer using the tools circled in red.
